

Piastrix, Russian gambling and IBOX: What Konstantyn Buriachenko is trying to hide behind the image of a biker



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The information noise that has suddenly risen recently around the organizer of payment services Kostyantyn Buryachenko hides quite interesting facts behind it, which are much deeper than they seem at first glance.

Remarkably, real facts are being concealed behind fake materials about Kostyantyn Buryachenko, intended to replace negative search results about his persona. But behind this attempt at information cleansing lies not just the story of the Piastrix payment service, but a years-long chain of people, banks, and legal entities, while Piastrix itself announced its complete closure.

What Kostyantyn Buryachenko is trying to hide

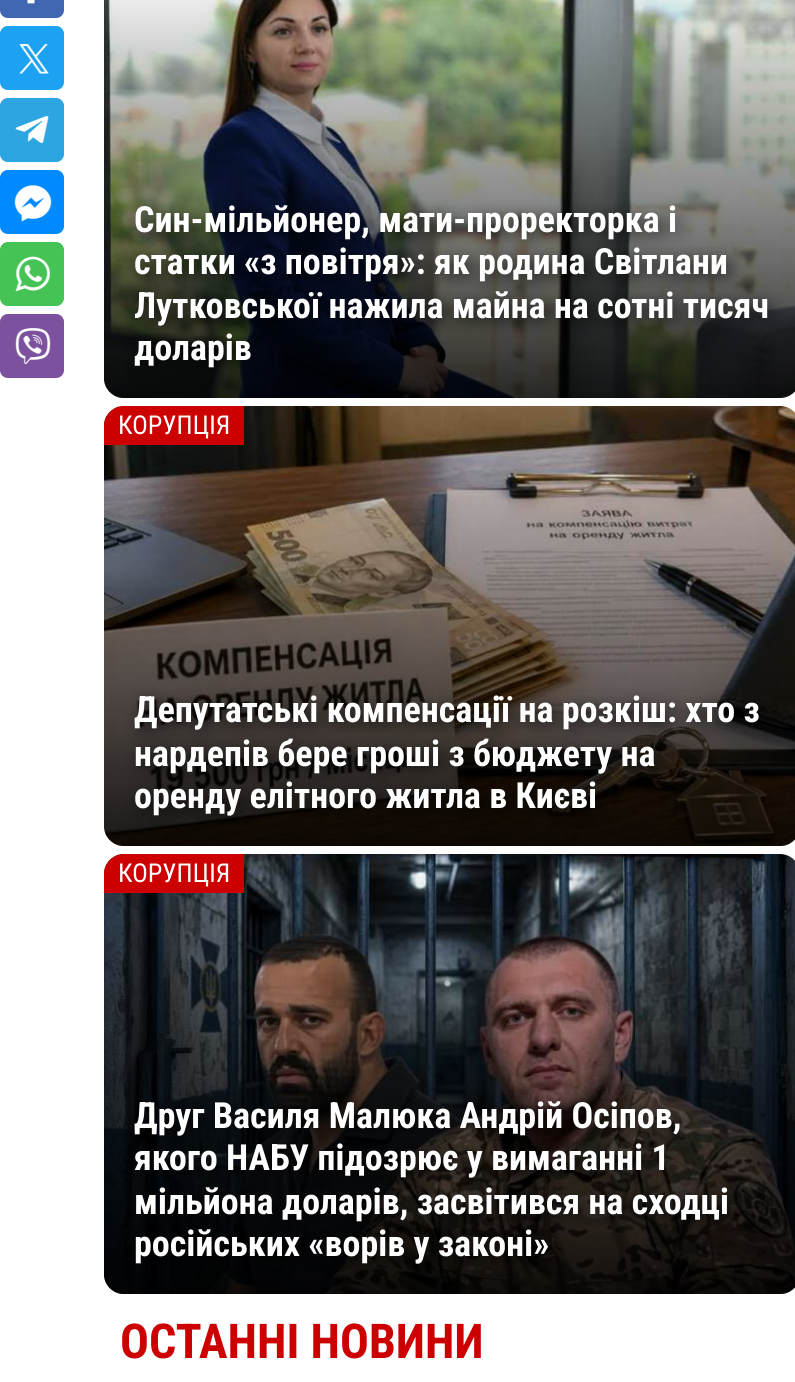
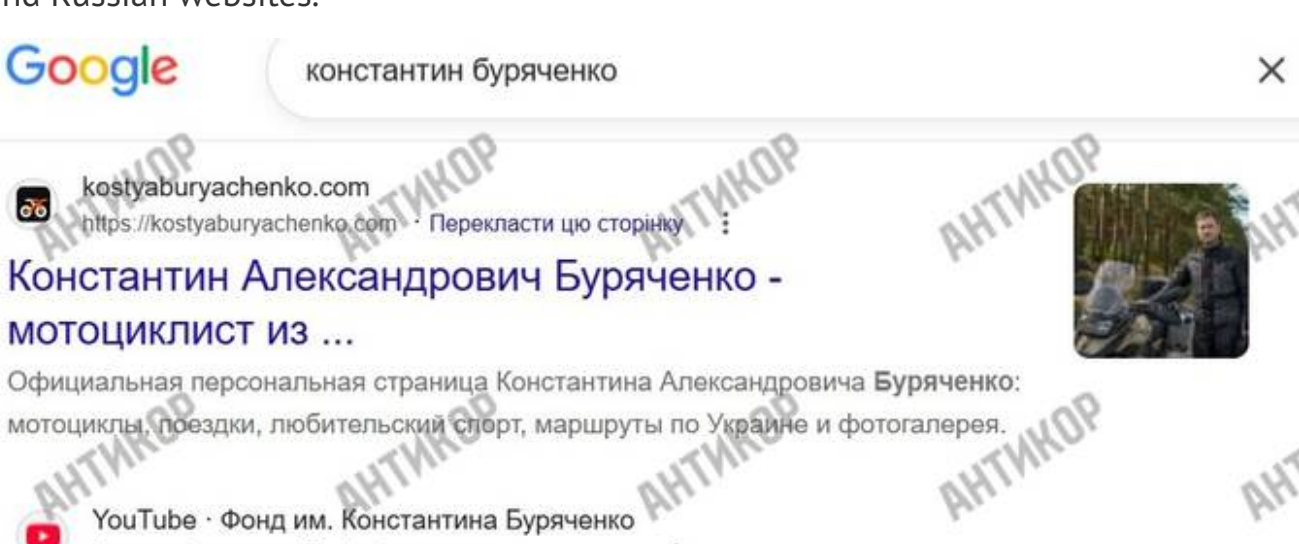
The name of Kostyantyn Buryachenko remained little known to the general public for nearly two decades, although he was one of the most important figures in the international payment infrastructure linked to high-risk gambling. His name surfaces in a chain involving Ukrainian banks and payment terminals, while structures he registered appear in Georgia, the Czech Republic, the United Kingdom, and Poland.

The situation changed in spring 2026, when a series of publications linked Buryachenko's name to the Payer and Piastrix payment services serving the Russian online gambling market, as well as to a network of companies and entrepreneurs overlapping with former employees of Alfa-Bank and IBOX Bank.

On May 4, a material about Piastrix appeared on Telegram and was removed the same day. The archive of publications records not only the text itself but also the fact of its deletion. In it, Buryachenko was named as the person behind Piastrix, and his business biography was linked to Polish, British, Czech, and Ukrainian structures. Already in July 2026, Piastrix announced the cessation of operations.

And almost simultaneously, materials began appearing online that were outwardly dedicated to Buryachenko but in fact contained no information about his business. Kostyantyn Buryachenko suddenly **turned into a motorcyclist** from Zhytomyr and an animal rights activist: search results became flooded with materials about Buryachenko positioning him as an experienced motorcyclist and head of a foundation helping animals. Moreover, these publications appeared on both Ukrainian and Russian websites.

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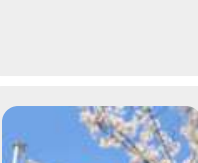
